

Tower of Strength for Immigrant Families

Councilmember Curren Price has been a longstanding champion of immigrant families. Over the years, he has allocated more than \$3 million in discretionary funds to expand free immigration legal services for District 9 constituents, the largest dollar amount ever committed by any Council person in Los Angeles' history.

Key accomplishments include:

- Years-long partnerships with the Coalition for Humane Immigrant Rights (CHIRLA), Central American Resource Center (CARECEN) and Black Alliance for Just Immigration (BAJI), expanding access to legal and consultation services, universal representation, community education and outreach in South LA.
- Dedicated immigration relief funds for CD9 constituents to become U.S. citizens, and to protect Deferred Action for Childhood Arrivals (DACA) beneficiaries, as well as individuals with Temporary Protected Status (TPS).
- Other immigration relief services available to Ninth District neighbors include family petitions, deportation defense, advance parole requests, representation in complex immigration cases and other family-based immigration relief for low-income constituents.
- In 2017, CHIRLA opened the first South LA Satellite Office within Councilman Price's District Office. Most recently, with Councilmember Price's support, CHIRLA opened a location at the CD 9 Neighborhood Resource Center at the Historic Serra Library (4255 S. Olive St.) for a minimum of 25 years at no charge.
