

Improving Parks and Recreation Centers Across District 9

Since assuming office in 2013, Councilmember Curren Price has helped secure more than \$60 million to make enhancements across every park and recreation center in District 9. Under his leadership, a wide variety of improvements and repairs have been made to help enhance the quality of life for neighbors, including: A Dodger Dreamfield at Gilbert Lindsay Recreation Center; South Central LA's first dog park; new play fields; basketball courts; playground equipment; outdoor fitness equipment; lighting; security cameras, and much more.

DISTRICT 9 HIGHLIGHTS

DODGER DREAMFIELD AT GILBERT LINDSAY RECREATION CENTER

Over the summer of 2021, the Gilbert Lindsay Recreation Center marked the debut of a Dodger Dreamfield where local children can play baseball and softball. The series of improvements included a new field, shade structures, fencing, bullpens, a solar scoreboard, upgraded sprinkler system, and the introduction of a concrete path and Americans with Disabilities Act (ADA) accessible bleachers.

TRINITY SKATE PARK

In the fall of 2021, the District 9 community welcomed the opening of its second state-of-the-art skatepark, located on the south side of the Trinity Recreation Center. This 3,000 square-foot skatepark installation brought additional improvements to the landscaping, benches, security cameras, and fencing around the park and the adjoining soccer field.





ROSS SNYDER DOG PARK

During the fall of 2022, Councilmember Price and the City of Los Angeles Department of Recreation and Parks celebrated the opening of the first dog park in South Central. With \$1 million in funding secured by the Council Office, the park now has areas for both small and large dogs, ADA-accessible concrete paths, shade canopies, seating areas, pet hydration stations, drinking fountains, and all-weather turf surfacing.

COMING SOON

BILL GREENE MEMORIAL PARK

For over six decades, an approximately 20,000-square-foot parcel owned by the Los Angeles Department of Water & Power at the intersection of Figueroa Street and Slauson Avenue remained unused. Councilmember Price took action to secure \$3.6 million to convert this vacant lot into a new park, which is expected to be completed by July 2025. The Bill Greene Memorial Park will feature a community amphitheater, landscaping, and self-cleaning restrooms, providing additional green space for the South LA community. The future community gem is being built in honor of the late State Sen. Bill Greene, who served as a Democratic member of the California State Assembly and the California State Senate, representing South Los Angeles for over 25 years.



INELL WOODS PARK

Located at 87th Street and McKinley Avenue, this future community pocket park is named after the late Inell Woods, a long-time resident and community champion for District 9. This 16,000-square-foot park will include a walking trail, exercise equipment, California-native landscaping, picnic tables, and seating areas. Councilmember Price was instrumental in securing over \$1.5 million in funding for the development of this new neighborhood park, expected to be completed by early 2025.

GREEN MEADOWS RECREATION CENTER

Councilmember Price was instrumental in securing a \$7 million grant from the State of California under Proposition 68 to enhance Green Meadows Recreation Center. The planned enhancements include the construction of a new soccer field with synthetic turf, a modernized recreation center, refurbishment of the baseball field, installation of two basketball courts with lighting, a new children's playground, an outdoor fitness area, BBQ/picnic area with shade structures, and various other improvements. The completion date is estimated for August 2025.
